POLICY RELATING TO THE USE OF PEEL PARK AND OTHER PARISH COUNCIL OWNED OPEN SPACES FOR FITNESS TRAINING AND OTHER ORGANISED AND SUPERVISED RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Clanfield Parish Council is pleased to permit the use of its open spaces free of charge for these purposes subject to the following Conditions:

- (a) The organiser and participants must live in the villages of Clanfield and Chalton or their environs.
- (b) The dates and times of use and location must be agreed in advance with the Clerk to the Parish Council to avoid use during unsociable hours and to avoid conflict between competing users.
- (c) A copy of the organiser's up-to-date Public Liability Insurance Certificate is to be provided to the Clerk before commencement of use.
- (d) It is the organiser's responsibility to inspect the land for hazards on each occasion before the use commences and the Parish Council will not accept any liability in that respect.
- (e) The organiser is to notify all users and participants of this Policy and the fact that the Council is not involved in any way with the running of the class or activity which is taking place.
- (f) No music is to be played at any time at any location.
- (g) No use of the pavilion at Peel Park or any buildings at other locations is permitted
- (h) The Parish Council does not guarantee that any user will have exclusive use of the open space which has been booked and users must give due consideration to other people who are legitimately using the open space.
- (i) The use of any area set aside for specific purposes or for formal play is prohibited. Such prohibited areas include children's play grounds, football pitches, the skate park at Peel Park and car parks (except to park cars).
- (j) Organisers and users are advised that there may be occasions when the Parish Council has to close vehicular access to car parks for security reasons and without prior notice.
- (k) All users must conduct their classes and activities strictly in compliance with the UK Government's requirements and guidelines.
